

Dicky joined the RN in 1981, initially as an Engineering Officer before transferring to the FAA for observer training in 1984. A stalwart of 849, Dicky served on both flights and on exchange with the USN on Hawkeye, before leaving regular service in 1997. His time in the RNR has included non-flying operational tours to Afghanistan and Bahrain along with augmentation support to 854 and 857 squadrons in the Middle East. Dicky was awarded the Queen's Volunteer Reserves Medal in 2011. His final years have been spent on 849 NAS - mainly ensuring the observers kept their Fighter Controller currency! A fantastic stint Dicky; many of our members will have benefited greatly from your expert instruction and mentoring over the years – enjoy your retirement!
