

Down Memory Lane.... Today is a very notable date in 849's history as it marks the 37th anniversary of the first live performance by the illustrious AEW Blues Band.



I was intrigued as to how the band started and Phil Howarth (849 Senior Observer at the time and original band member) takes up the story.

'Nick Funnell had kidded me before we went on Christmas leave that he had been chatting to his local pub landlord about this great band and had procured an invitation for us to play there. We all then disappeared on leave whilst I set about getting the embryo band to put together a couple of 30 minute sets in time for us to do something in January. So, we practised throughout leave to put a good blues and rock show together ready to take to the road and find fame! On 1st January, myself and my wife met with Nick Funnell and his wife for a lunchtime drink at the Trengilly Wartha and I proudly proclaimed that the band were ready to rock and roll. "What date have you fixed?" I asked Nick, noting the growing paleness of his complexion – yet another Hogmanay overdose thought I. "Oh SObs" said he, (what happened to the friendly 'Phil' tag thought the wives?). "It was just my fun banter with you before Christmas. There is no gig, I didn't fix a band date...That night I just went for a pee!" I dispatched Nick to search for the owner of the Trengilly and to return only when he had fixed a date, which he duly did!' The original 849 band members were the lead singer Colin Richardson, Peter Flutter (849 CO) who played the blues harp (and had a flair for wrecking the band equipment whilst dancing on stage) with Phil Howarth and Simon Langley on rhythm guitar.

With their first gig a resounding success (perhaps partly due to the Boss imposing a 3 line whip on squadron aircrew and students) the AEW Blues Band went from strength to strength playing a pub gig on the last Saturday of each month plus Wardroom Mess Balls and other events. On occasion they had up to 12 band members, including Dick Buckland (also of 849) on alto sax. They released 2 albums 'Central Heating for Europe' and 'Take Cover' selling all 1800 cassettes produced and many t-shirts to their adoring fans. What a great time to be on 849!
