Every November the Poppy Factory charity organise the Field of Remembrance at Westminster Abbey, which is made up of over 300 individual association plots. I'm pleased to confirm that the AnyFace Association has been allocated a plot from 2022 onwards which will provide us the opportunity to plant a symbol for each of those fallen comrades from 849 NAS. The Field of Remembrance will be open from 10 Nov 22 (usually for around 10 days).

The Poppy Factory was opened in 1922 by Major George Howson MC to produce poppies and provide employment for veterans injured during WW1. Today the Poppy Factory still produce wreaths, crosses and symbols for the RBL and also provides support to veterans with health conditions on their journey into civilian employment.
